Subject: Daedalian Scholarships 2022

Dear Ms. Warner;

The Order of Daedalians is a professional order of American military pilots (all services, active and retired), with a mission to advocate for air and space power, honor those who flew and fly in defense of our nation, and inspire young Americans to pursue careers as military aviators through college scholarships, flying instruction, and other educational opportunities.

The local Daedalians are organized as the George E. "Bud" Day Flight, comprised of more than 100 active and retired U.S. military pilots. We have, for a number of years, provided multiple scholarship opportunities to local high school students interested in military aviation, and recently broadened these scholarship opportunities to include students in the STEM disciplines necessary to support military aviation. We've historically addressed all of the Okaloosa County high schools and our immediate "neighbors" at Navarre High School and Walton High School.

This letter is to make each school's guidance counselors (and JROTC units, if appropriate) aware of these opportunities. The scholarships *are not* limited to JROTC cadets.

Qualified candidates are invited to apply for one of these scholarships using the form available on-line at [www.daedalians.org](http://www.daedalians.org) > Programs > Scholarships > Downloadable Application. Applicants should complete the form for a *Matching* scholarship, and select George E. "Bud" Day Flight #61 as the sponsoring flight.

Selectees will be notified as soon as possible thereafter, but not later than 18 March 2022, and awardees will be honored at our Flight Meeting on Thursday, 21 April 2022. Invitations with meeting details will be sent to those selected for a scholarship award.

The Bud Day Flight Scholarship Committee will base our selection on the following criteria. The successful applicant must:

1. Be an American citizen.
2. Be a graduating senior from an accredited public / private high school, or, if home schooled, successfully complete any required state examinations.
3. Have a cumulative Grade Point Average of 3.0 (on a 4.0-point scale) and an ACT score of 26 or better, or the SAT equivalent.
4. Have applied for and been admitted to a four-year college / university.
5. Commit to enroll in and complete a four-year ROTC Program.
6. If physically qualified, commit to seeking entrance to a military aviation training program (pilot, navigator, combat systems officer, naval flight officer, air battle manager, astronaut, RPA pilot, or flight surgeon), or to pursue a career in one of the STEMM disciplines on completion of schooling.
7. Complete the referenced Daedalian Scholarship Application and include the following attachments:
  - a. Most recent high school academic transcript
  - b. ACT / SAT score(s)
8. Complete a personal or telephone interview with the Bud Day Flight Scholarship Committee, if requested.

Students receiving full scholarships for all expenses, including room and board, from other sources are not eligible.

If selected for one of the Bud Day Flight scholarships, the awardee may be eligible for a matching scholarship awarded by the Daedalian Foundation at the national level. Funds awarded will be disbursed directly to the student's college or university financial office for credit to his or her account. If awarded a scholarship, the student will be obligated to inform us annually of their progress.
